Applicants Sought for Citizens Advisory Committee
For
Developing New Master Plan for Swedish Medical Center Cherry Hill Campus

The Seattle Department of Neighborhoods and Swedish Medical Center are seeking community members to serve on the Swedish Medical Center Cherry Hill Campus Major Institution Master Plan Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC). Swedish Medical Center is beginning the process to develop a new Master Plan to guide future development at their Cherry Hill campus (Previously known as Providence Hospital). The Master Plan will include the types and locations of new physical development at Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus and establish guidelines for the design of future development on campus, a transportation management plan and other actions to reduce the possible negative impacts of proposed development on the surrounding neighborhood.

The Advisory Committee will be comprised of 6 - 12 members and 3 alternates representing the neighborhood surrounding Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus, plus city residents at-large and users of the Medical Center. Where possible, members should possess expertise and experience in one or more of the following areas: neighborhood organization and issues, land use and zoning, architecture, landscaping, economic development, building development and/or medical services. The Advisory Committee typically meets monthly for approximately two years, or until the master plan is completed. More frequent meetings may at times be necessary.

The City is committed to promoting diversity in the City's boards and commissions; so, women, young persons, senior citizens, persons with disabilities, sexual and gender minorities, persons of color, and immigrants are encouraged to apply.

Those interested in being considered for positions on the committee should submit a letter or e-mail to the address below, indicating their interest to serve and describing any special or unique qualifications they bring.

The deadline for receiving submittals is 5 p.m. on **January 10, 2012**. The City and Swedish Medical Center Staff then will interview candidates and select the persons to be recommended for appointment to the CAC by the Seattle City Council.
