

Magnuson Park Nature Programs

At 350 acres, Magnuson is Seattle's second largest park, and contains a unique variety of habitats and features. Located on the Sand Point Peninsula in northeast Seattle, with a splendid mile-long stretch of Lake Washington shoreline, this former Navy airfield has been transformed into a treasure. Miles of trails take you through forest, grassland, garden, lakeshore, and an exciting new 12-acre wetlands. Stop by the Magnuson Community Center in the park's Historic District for a map and a visit to its new Bird-friendly Landscape. The Community Center is also headquarters for a wide array of nature field trips, classes, camps, and hikes for children and adults. Discover a great urban park with a storied past, exciting present, and bright future!
