The Age 55+ Employment Resource Center can assist you in your job search. We provide career information, job search guidance, and training referrals for Seattle residents age 55 and over. In addition, we administer the Title V Senior Community Service Employment Program for income-eligible seniors throughout King County, providing opportunities for mature jobseekers to gain a training position and stipend while they conduct their job search. SCSEP has specific income eligibility criteria.*

WHAT WE DO

Age 55+ Employment Resource Center services include:

- Job lists
- Training resources to upgrade job skills, including computer skills classes
- Computer access for resume writing and Internet research
- Individual job counseling
- Quarterly employment workshops
- Employer outreach

WHAT YOU DO

Your mission is to look for work! The Age 55+ Employment Resource Center will help you with your job search. To help you get started, we have provided a checklist (see reverse).

Once assigned to a Job Counselor, we ask that you contact your Job Counselor at least once every 30 days to talk about your training experiences, job applications and interviews, and get valuable feedback and referrals. In addition, we ask that you let us know when you start a new job.

* **Title V SCSEP Eligibility:** The Senior Community Service Employment Program, funded under Title V of the federal Older Americans Act, is open to unemployed King County residents age 55+ with total household income at or below 125 percent Federal Poverty Level. To find out if you are SCSEP-eligible, you will need to provide income information for the last 6–12 months, including a copy of last year's tax return, a recent Social Security statement (if you receive Social Security benefits) and/or a Statement of Earnings (available from WorkSource). In addition, you will need government-issued identification. Other documents may be required (i.e., veteran status, pay stubs).
