

Pro Parks Levy Oversight Committee: Recommendations for the Pro Parks Opportunity Fund, May 14, 2002 - First Funding Cycle 2001-2002

On May 14, 2002 the Pro Parks Oversight Committee unanimously approved the following recommendations for acquisition and development projects to be funded by the first cycle of the Pro Parks Opportunity Fund. The Committee's recommendations will be forwarded to the Superintendent, Mayor and City Council.

In addition to the recommendations described above, the Committee earlier designated \$3 million of the Opportunity Fund's first cycle for acquisition in underserved urban center villages: University District, Denny Triangle, and Pioneer Square/International District.

The Pro Parks Levy, approved by Seattle voters in November 2000, included the \$10 million Opportunity Fund. The Committee allocated \$6 million for the first cycle, and has recommended the projects outlined above.
